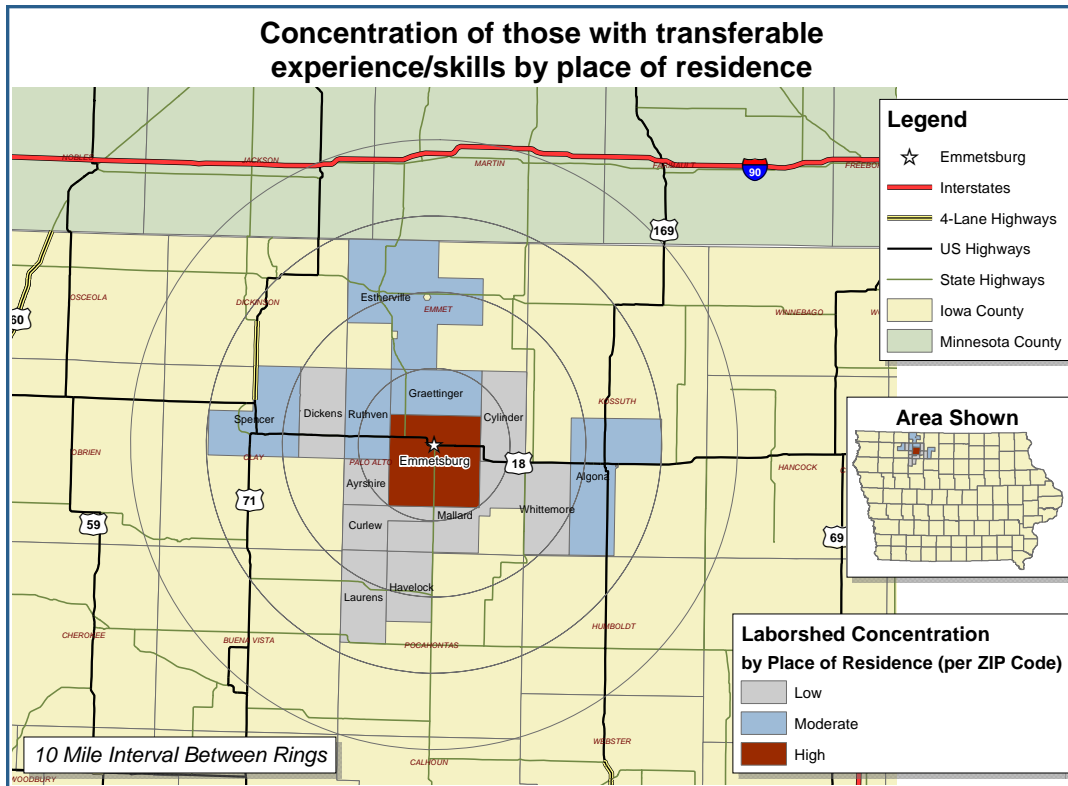


# Labor Characteristics
